Just a couple short reminders this month. First, remember to check the calendar within the newsletter.

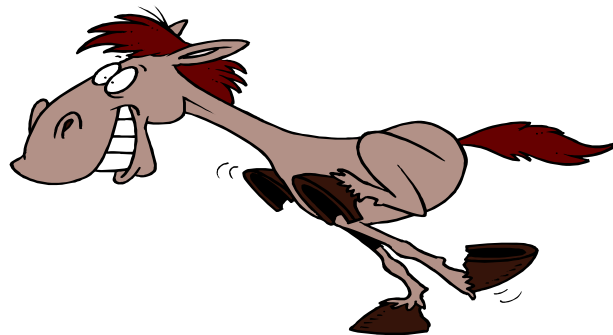

Meeting called to order at Community Bank South, Pendleton by Vice President Rob Stahl at 7:14 P.M..

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Rob reported a balance of \$1146.15.

**(MSP) MOTION:** Phil to approve minutes. **SECONDED:** Nyla seconded. **PASSED.**

**OLD BUSINESS:** Dogs on Rides: Rob reported that there 17 votes returned. 15 - No votes and 2 - Yes votes. Roz commented that one ride could be designated for dogs. Meeting called to order at Community Bank South, Pendleton by President Debbie Sutor at 7:10 P.M..

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Karen reported a balance of \$790.15. Paid \$394.00 state dues. Still need to donate \$30.00 to Hells Canyon.

**(MSP) MOTION:** Phil Hilton to approve minutes. **SECONDED:** Brenda Lieuallen seconded. **PASSED.**

**OLD BUSINESS:** Bed Raffle: Gwen Winters won the bed raffle. She is wanting to sell the bed and is selling to the highest bidder. A man is coming to look at it for \$200.00. Please remember that Logs n' Stuff donated the bed and to thank them.

**Insurance:** 2nd page in handout under ("More Good News"). The regulation has been postponed because of the large amount of response!! Congress received numerous letters.

**NEW BUSINESS:** Quest Warnings: LaDonna Cozby reported on the "Quest Wormer" information in packet. Please read!!

**Wilderness Trails Maintenance Crew:** Debbie reported that Rick is looking for a work crew for the summer.

**Snacks for the Meetings:** Kathy volunteered to bring snacks to the next meeting.

**TRAIL:** Vernita said the guys talked at the last meeting and kind of left her out. Debbie told us about some trails that Rob had suggested.

Phil wanted to know the state ruling on dogs not being allowed on trail rides. He wants to see the rule. Leaving it open to discussion. Debbie said the background is that the Pendleton Chapter discussed not allowing dogs on trails when the group first started. Wanted to follow other chapters. Nothing is in stone and no vote was ever taken.

Discussion: 33 members - 20 dogs not a good scenario. Figure out a way to fix the problem. Maybe only certain rides? Rotate rides? Have courtesy to put owner responsible if horse/person/dog gets injured. Not all dogs get along. State ride had 12 dogs and had no problems. Definitely a safety liability. No access to a hospital while on trail rides. What about novice and inexperienced riders? Someone is bound to get hurt. Who is going to judge which dogs are acceptable? Negative experiences with dogs in groups, usually a nuisance. Are people allergic?

**(MSP) MOTION:** Brenda to put to mail a ballot asking a Yes/No vote to bring canines on rides. **SECONDED:** Dick seconded. **PASSED.**

Phil also wanted to know about smoking policy. Dick said during break time not on horseback would be acceptable. Debbie will find out what insurance calls for. Debbie is going to state meeting next weekend, will find out and get back to us.

**TRAIL cont.:** Debbie relayed for Rob. Overnighter: Kathryn Creek, North Fork, camp at trail, ride to loop then sleep over. South Fork, Walla Walla, Milton-Freewater, 15 miles. Downside to this trail is a lot of motorcycles, backpackers, and bicyclists.

Brenda suggested doing a training for horses by bringing people with backpacks to walk around and get horses used to them. Dick offered that we do a "Sensitivity Course". Brenda offered her 10 acres towards the casino, Patawa Creek, to do the training. Dick will come up with a date and time at the next meeting. Volunteers needed, motorcycles, raincoats, kids, etc..

Stumbo Ridge Loop, up the Umatilla, 3 miles past Gibbon. Parking is bad, steep territory and no trail. Would be a 6 or 7 mile ride in early season. 9 Mile Loop, up the Umatilla, past Bar M, Kiwanis cabins. Walla Walla chapter is cleaning the trail. Would be another early season ride. Suggestion of computer generated maps. Debbie and Rick thought that we would be able to ride/stop and clean along the way while working on the Big Creek Trail Memorial Day weekend. Phone committee will notify. Mt. Emily, set dates with no time limits. Phil suggested doing a ride this Sunday, May 6th at Canine Ridge, down Oregon trail.

**(MSP) MOTION:** Phil that Pendleton chapter ride Sunday, May 6, 2001 in Umatilla along the Columbia River and meet at the Pendleton Convention Center at 8:00 P.M.. **SECONDED:** Jim seconded the motion. **PASSED.**

Wait till the June meeting to decide any more rides.

**WORK:** Nobody at the meeting. Doing a trail ride on Memorial weekend. Will be at Ukiah, "Big Creek" campground. Not mandatory to come all 3 days. Phone committee will call with directions.

**PRESS/PR:** Brenda asks for volunteers. Kathy volunteered.

**FUNDRAISING:** Will talk after meeting.

**LEGISLATIVE:** Nobody at meeting.
